Our school is situated in the heart of the national Forest overlooking Thornton Reservoir.



Foundation

Our school is small with an intake of 20 pupils in the Foundation Stage which offers numerous benefits for children's first experiences of school.

We provide a secure, play-based and integrated environment where children become happy, independent learners who flourish at their own pace, building on their own starting points. Our broad and balanced curriculum provides opportunities for learning both inside and outdoors. It enables pupils to develop personally, socially, emotionally spiritually, physically, creatively and intellectually to their full potential, and also sets firm foundations for future learning in Key Stage 1 and beyond.

We strongly value excellent relationships with parents and carers to build a strong partnership in supporting your child's learning.



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Our Curriculum

At Thornton, we offer an engaging and challenging curriculum designed to:

- Develop pupils' skills to the very best of their ability in Mathematics and English as subjects in their own right and across other areas of the curriculum.
- Build knowledge, skills and understanding; providing opportunities to question, explore and research, reason and solve problems, think critically, weigh up evidence and debate arguments.
- ★ Provide opportunity to exercise creativity and imagination.
- Foster a curiosity, fascination and deeper understanding of the wider world and its people, in the past, present and in the future.
- ★ Equip learners with the skills and knowledge necessary to become safe, active participants in a digital world.
- ★ Provide opportunities to build character, develop resilience and embed values to enable pupils to reach their full potential academically, socially, physically and mentally in preparation for the responsibilities and experiences of later life.

Our curriculum is designed using evidence from learning principles, on-going assessment and organisation and cognitive research. It is built on the key principles:

- Start with each learner's current understanding.
- Involving the learner actively in the learning process.
- ★ Promote metacognition by helping pupils understand purpose, quality criteria, and self-assessment.
- An emphasis on the social aspects of learning.
- Organisation of the curriculum to allow regular review and reinforcement of knowledge and skills.

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Wellbeing and Pastoral Support

We are committed to supporting the emotional health and wellbeing of our pupils and staff.

We know that everyone experiences life challenges that can make us vulnerable and at times, anyone may need additional emotional support. We work collaboratively to promote positive mental health across the school.

At Thornton we:

- help children to understand their emotions and feelings
- promote an environment in which children feel safe to share their concerns or worries
- ★ support children to form and maintain positive relationships
- と promote self esteem
- help children develop resilience and equip them with coping strategies when they experience setbacks.

We offer different levels of support:

Universal support - This aims to meet the needs of all pupils through our school ethos, wider curriculum and commitment to the Route to Resilience programme.

Additional support - this can be provided to support children who have short term needs, such as children who have been made vulnerable through life experiences such as bereavement.

Targeted support - For those children who need more differentiated support, and targeted interventions such as ELSA sessions, well-being groups.

Location

We are incredibly fortunate to have Thornton Reservoir within walking distance of our school. Regular outings to the reservoir and the surrounding area enhance their understanding of the environment, stimulate curiosity and foster a love of the outdoors and nature. Moreover, outdoor activities promote physical health and well-being, offering a break from classroom routines. By exploring the local area and our school ground nature areas, children also develop observational and investigative skills, which are crucial for their overall cognitive development.

Enrichment Opportunities

We pride ourselves on developing a wide range of enrichment activities to both supplement and further enhance the curriculum. These can be experience and theme days throughout the school, special visitors and also opportunities to go on exciting trips and residential visits. Our yearly destinations include day trips to Stonehurst Farm in Reception, Year 1 and 2 outdoor learning at Bosworth Park, Year 3 and 4 Richard III Museum and Viking experience day, Year 5 WWII experience day, Year 6 Warning Zone, Y Theatre and Team Building Day at Beaumanor Hall. We also arrange two exciting residential visits to Beaumanor Hall in Year 1 and 2 and in Years 4 and 5, where the children get the opportunity to experience more varied outdoor and adventurous activities such as archery, wall climbing and canoeing.

Encompassing Creativity

Art, design, drama, dance and music complement many of our curriculum areas. Alongside our Art and Design curriculum, where pupils learn to use a range of materials, techniques, and the study of different artists, pupils also get the opportunity to celebrate their work through exciting displays throughout the school and also their work being exhibited in exhibitions, festivals and competitions. We are very proud of our exhibited work throughout the school and the vibrant and stimulating learning environment we have created.



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Our Wrap around Care

Our wrap-around care offers a safe and supervised environment for our children outside of standard school hours.

It provides enrichment opportunities, socialisation and peer interaction. No notice is required. We understand that lives can be busy and hectic, and it's not always possible to plan ahead. We aim to assist you in managing the balance between work and family life.
